Art

- Our focus in Art this term has been printmaking. A good activity to continue this learning at home is to look at Pointillist style paintings and painters including non-European Aboriginal artwork and George Seurat. The students could attempt their own pointillist style painting using the theme 'nature'. By using a cotton bud or end of a pencil they can create the rounded point effect. Alternatively, the students could use colouring pencils to draw the rounded points to fill the spaces of their pencil drawing.
